On this cover, I have chosen Marcus Mitchell, a young man who has risen through the ranks for twenty nine years to become a Major on the Memphis Police Force, in 2021. Throughout his career, he has focused on working with youth.

He is a LeMoyne Owen Graduate Basketball Player who used his

talents to coach basketball and foodball at several schools and leagues for youth throughout Shelby County. He is currently a member of the Memphis Grizzly Team Mentor Program but has also spent countless hours working with children while Community Policing, and working with the Police Athletic League.

Mitchell believes that he is the right person to be the Juvenile Clerk because it's all about the children. Mitchell says that he has spent hours volunteering in various programs to aid and guide young children away from trouble for years. Mitchell's interest and concern reaches beyond the young people he counsels as demonstrated in how he councets with parents to help provide parenting skills. He recently held a "Maga with Mitch" meeting with mothers to learn what could be done collectively to encourage and support our youth. He plans to host a round table discussion with fathers to get their input and perspective on how to keep children out of the juvenile system, and how together, we can prevent them from becoming another statistic.

I believe that you and I have some of the same concerns for our young men and women. Just looking at the world we live in now makes me a little nervous about what they will be facing. I share your concerns and that is why I believe that Marcus Mitchell will make a big difference. I like the idea of having a law enforcement person that is personable and sincerely dedicated to the welfare of these children, making decisions and fighting for their survival. Yes I like this young man and I think he will get the job done.



Another race that I need to stick my neck out for is the Circuit Clerk. I thought I would stay out of that race but recent activity on the part of the incumbent has forced me to speak my peace. It is baffling to me why there has been so much chaos and discourse between the clerk and the judges. I think it is in large part because the incumbent did not have enough information about what the job actually entailed. At least in a conversation with me, she admitted as much and said she regretted getting off to a bad start and wishes she had done things differently. The problem is that even after that conversation, her irrational behavior continued as noted in her Facebook post where she often enjoys posting her grievances...whether merited or not. For example, she has complained to me and many people that several of the judges appear on a flyer (see flyer above) to endorse her opponent before the opponent had pulled a petition. Ironically the flyer she refers to is simply a flyer for a fundraiser that her opponent participated in to help raise money for school supplies. It features several judges that donated and some people that are not judges. I even donated money. Nowhere does that flyer ever mention the incumbent's name or remotely refer to her.

Other irrational comments include the recent Facebook post where she asked GOD to basically eliminate her opponents and then quotes a scripture that warns of the wrath of those who are against her (paraphrasing). Any person who claims a judge was hit by a truck because that judge did not support her simply has no business being in a position of leadership. As old folks like me often say.. this person is more than a notion. The judges need a clerk that they can relate to. Not someone there to create chaos or to be combative. Paradoxically, the incumbent made frivolous complaints to the FBI and the DA's office regarding rumors, erroneous flyers and hearsay that was unsubstantiated. Get that! In the middle of one of our largest elections, these baseless claims about our candidates were given to law enforcement to spark investigations! I believe it's a campaign ploy to create sympathy and boost her re-election bid.

As we near the close of Black History Month, we remember the successes, the struggles, triumpls, and trials of the past while we celebrate the present and contemplate the future. It is important to remember that we stand on the shoulders of giants. It is also important to remember that Black history is American history! As our nation sought to

suppress the hopes and dreams of her darker sisters and brothers, as well as her brown, yellow, and red sisters and brothers, as time for us to celebrate the racial and ethnic mosaic that is America. BLACK HISTORY

THE MEMPHIS RED SOX NATIONAL NEGRO LEAGUE



The year was 1920 and the nation's pass-time was major league baseball. However, no black players were allowed to play in the majors. Consequently, black businessmen and businesswomen began investing in their own professional sports franchises.

Most major cities had a black owned and operated professional baseball club. Memphis was no exception. A local barber and barber college owner, named Arthur P. Martin formed the Barber College Baseball Club. As they toured the region winning games, Arthur Martin reached out to his three brothers (all of whom were doctors and business leaders) and reformed the team as the Memphis Red Sox. They joined the now famous National Negro League and the rest is history.

Most of the games were played at Bellevue Park (now known as Jesse Turner Park) at South Parkway and Bellevue. The team continued to thrive for almost 40 years. However when Jackie Robinson was allowed to enter into the white Major League Baseball,



it spelled the beginning of the end to all of the Negro League teams. One by one, the white teams began picking off the top players from throughout the Negro League.

There was one star player for Memphis that chose not to go to the majors, but moved to Nashville and became one of the greatest stars music has ever known. That man was County singer Charley Pride. Charley Pride played for the Memphis Red Sox until its demise in 1959. However he was able to turn his music talents into millions of dollars and an entry into both the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame and Country Music Hall of Fame. Pride recently died and was remembered all over the world.

However most fans had no idea he once was a awesome baseball player with the Memphis Red Sox. On another note..... once white teams saw the profit potential in black baseball, they decided to desegregate. This has been the same in most industries. Black's are only given an opportunity when someone recognizes the profit potential in doing so.

This has been a moment in Memphis Black History.


